WISH I WAS HERE

Synopsis

Aidan Bloom and his wife Sarah (Kate Hudson) are a Los Angeles couple barely getting by financially: she supports them and their two kids (Joey King and Pierce Gagnon) with a low level public service job, and he's a struggling actor who spends most of his time fantasizing about being the futuristic space knight he dreamed he'd be as a child.

When they learn their father (Mandy Patinkin) is sick, Aidan and his brother Noah (Josh Gad) - whose relationship with the old man has always been troubled - are first forced, then inspired, to make major changes in their lives. Aidan embarks on a chaotic attempt to homeschool his kids as his father can no longer afford to pay for their schooling, while Noah tries to assert his creativity by embracing the world of CosPlay and attending a comic book convention.

Directed by Zach Braff from a screenplay written by Braff and his brother Adam Braff, WISH I WAS HERE tells a funny, touching, universal story of what it means to be a parent, spouse, and child eschewing religious and cultural tradition in the modern age, and the fulfillment that can come through embracing new chapters and ways of life.

ABOUT THE PRODUCTION

Ten years after *Garden State* made a splash at the Sundance Film Festival, Zach Braff returns to Park City with his follow-up: *Wish I Was Here*. Starring Braff, Natalie Portman and Peter Sarsgaard, *Garden State* enraptured audiences with its unique account of a twenty-something actor's return home following the death of his mother. While not a sequel, *Wish I Was Here* brings Braff's specific point-of-view to thirty-somethings, this time exploring a Los Angeles-based actor's late-blooming maturity.

Braff co-wrote *Wish I Was Here* with his brother, Adam Braff. The story started small: "What if a guy like my brother or me was trying to home school his kids, and at first he was horrible about it until he embraced doing it his own way. It was a good entrance into a story for both of us," Zach Braff says.

What evolved from that germ of an idea was a screenplay about a family that is at a turning point, struggling with an imminent loss and finding their way to the next phase of their lives. "We're writing about what we know," Zach Braff explains. "The idea of trying to hold on to your dream while you have kids to support, and a wife who is a breadwinner and tasked with making all the money was interesting."

Written over the course of a year, the screenplay was batted back and forth between the two brothers. Adam Braff explains the process: "We got together for a couple of weeks and created an outline. We went our separate ways, and we did a lot of the writing online. I love being able to write and get feedback from a writing partner in the evening. Without that, you're left with your own assessment. It's nice to hear another voice."

Ultimately, the Braff brothers found a balance between each of their points of view. "There are some scenes that were blended together that turned out really well. We have different voices, but we were able to blend them together," Adam Braff says.

Although the story of *Wish I Was Here* is grounded in personal drama, there is a supernatural element that exists entirely in Aidan's imagination. "I had such a wild imagination as a child," notes Zach Braff. "Aidan's dream world was born out of

the idea that a grown person who's ostensibly in mourning for the great man he never became, could continue to dream in the surreal landscape he created as a child. In that world, Aidan is valued and needed and heroic. Ultimately, he discovers it's a form of spirituality."

Faced with the decline of his father's health, Aidan explores his relationship with his religion. "I had organized religion blasted at me as a child. It didn't land for me. It didn't stick. But now, at thirty-eight-years old, I long for some spirituality," Zach Braff says.

With the script in place, Braff and producers Stacey Sher and Michael Shamberg set out to seek funding for the project. The meetings proved worrisome, as the financiers would not allow Braff to have final cut of his film, his Los Angeles story might have to be shot in Atlanta or Vancouver, and he wouldn't have control over casting.

Braff, Sher and Shamberg looked for some creative alternatives and Sher pushed to fund the movie on the crowdfunding site Kickstarter. "When we were having a surprisingly difficult time getting money for the film, and it looked like we weren't going to make the film or we were going to make it in such a compromised way that it still might not come together, it became obvious to us that it was just as much of a risk to do try this new paradigm," Sher says.

"Rob Thomas and Kristen Bell had their big success on Kickstarter with *Veronica Mars,*" Braff recalls. "I had been involved with Kickstarter because I love gadgets and I love innovation. I'm blessed with a loyal web following. With that knowledge, we said, 'It's worth a try.' You make your pitch to the people, and people say 'yes,' or 'no."

With that, Braff, Shamberg and Sher took to the Internet for funding. The campaign was met with an unbelievable enthusiasm; becoming fully funded in a staggering 48 hours. Braff was eager to make good on the investment. "We want to deliver for these people that have invested in us."

In fact, Braff had enlisted co-producer Coco Francini to constantly keep the Kickstarter backers in mind. Braff says, "I said to Coco, who was going to be running

the whole thing, 'I want it to be like you're the concierge at the fanciest hotel in the world, and these people are all your hotel guests.'"

The Kickstarter campaign exceeded expectations and raised 3.1 million dollars, over a million over the goal. Francini notes, "There is nothing more motivational than having almost fifty-thousand people cheering you on. We knew we needed to deliver a great movie and a great experience for the entire community that came together to make this film a reality"

After the successful fundraising campaign, Braff was ready to roll. Kate Hudson plays Aidan's beleaguered wife, Sarah. For Hudson, choosing to sign on to *Wish I Was Here* was an easy decision. She and Braff have known each other for years and have searched for the right opportunity to work together. "Zach has been a friend of mine for many years now," Hudson says. "When he started to get this project going, I read it and I connected so much to the story and the script. It felt like some of it was a slice out of my own life. It was one of the best things Zach has ever written, and I've read pretty much everything that he's written."

Braff had been a fan of his leading lady for some time. "When I saw Kate in *Almost Famous,* My jaw dropped," he remembers. "I had that excitement you feel when a new giant talent has been discovered. I've been trying to work with her ever since."

Braff also knew that his comfortable relationship with Hudson would translate to the screen. "We became friends some years back," he recalls. "We have a fun friendship, and a fun repartee, and it was great to dive into a movie with that already, and not have to fake it. I love Kate and she genuinely makes me laugh. I knew that would come across in the characters and in the relationship."

"Sarah is supporting the family. She's the one with the steady job, and she's miserable," Hudson says of her character. "And yet she loves her husband, but she realizes she has been supporting his dream, which is not really happening."

"When you're trying to keep things afloat and you've got all these plates spinning, the struggle starts to beat you down," Hudson says of Aidan and Sarah's relationship. "You don't have time for each other. You don't have the opportunities to connect like you wish you could. It can be difficult. Sarah backs up and lets Aidan

take the reigns to see how he can handle connecting and being fully responsible for the kids. Any parent will find this story relatable. This is the real version of a family."

Mandy Patinkin took on the role of Saul Bloom, Aidan's ailing father. Braff cast Patinkin in the film shortly after running into him by chance in New York City. They had never met before, but Braff was a huge fan and felt compelled to say hello. Once the Kickstarter succeeded and the film was essentially greenlit, Braff sent Mandy the script. Mandy recalls, "I read it and I just fell in love with it. Instantly, I'm weeping at the end of it and I can't believe how beautiful this is. And I also thought, there's no way on earth I'm gonna be able to do it because of *Homeland*."

Fortunately, Sher was able to work out the scheduling conflicts with the *Homeland* producers, which allowed Mandy to make it to Los Angeles during the last four days of production to shoot his scenes in the film. "Getting to work with Mandy Patinkin has just been a treat and we are treasuring every moment that *Homeland* is letting us have him. He breaks your heart. He makes a choice that just surprises you when you are sitting there at the monitor watching it and the next thing you know you're crying," Sher says.

Patinkin relished the chance to be part of telling a story about spirituality and the nature of life without the effects, spectacle and other tricks that Hollywood seems to rely on in modern films. He says, "There's nothing like good old fashioned stories between people. This is a movie about waking up and not missing life, because you don't get a second chance. You only get one shot and it's over faster than you can ever imagine anything in the world. What a beautiful project to be a part of."

For Josh Gad, who joined the production as Noah, the Kickstarter campaign was an impetus to be a part of *Wish I Was Here*. "I became interested in this film from the second it was announced. I was fascinated by crowdfunding a film from scratch, and I've been a massive fan of Zach Braff ever since *Garden State* -- I thought it spoke to my generation in particular, and I was blown away by the kind of performances he evoked as a director. I wanted to be a part of his next project. I

read the script and doubled down on that thought. It was an exploration of self-discovery unlike anything else I've done before."

While Aidan struggles with his role as a father and husband, his brother Noah has unresolved feelings as a son. "He comes with a lot of baggage," Gad explains. "He's cynical, for lack of a better word, in this movie that is in many ways about religion and discovery. He strongly has an opposing view to that. His battle comes from his insecurity, I think."

Rounding out the Bloom family are Joey King and Pierce Gagnon as Grace and Tucker. "Working with Joey and Pierce has been eye-opening. It makes you feel insecure about your own skills as an actor. They don't have that thing that makes you insecure about choices, so they just jump into it. It's so exciting to watch," Gad says.

"I literally was watching Pierce in *Looper*, paused and called my brother to say 'I found Tucker," Braff recalls of seeing Gagnon for the first time. "I never read another boy for the role."

"Joey King is a beautiful young actress. She's present and spontaneous and her instincts are gold," Hudson says. "She has the most beautiful little face on film. She gets the beats and understands the drama, and she understands the sensitivity and vulnerability."

For Adam Braff, watching the family come together was a huge reward. Adam Braff comments: "One of the things that has moved me and that I hoped we would be able to accomplish is create the feeling that this is really a family. I think we did that, and it has a lot to do with the actors meshing together. The actor often brings something I didn't expect, that I love even more than what I anticipated."

Ashley Greene plays Janine, Noah's cosplay-obsessed neighbor. Greene and Braff met about four years ago, when they were both cast in a project that unfortunately fell apart. Greene was happy to have a second chance with *Wish I Was Here*. "It all fell into place and I jumped on board," she says.

Greene loved the quick, funny, outrageous dialogue that set the script apart. "Zach and Adam have a way of taking these difficult issues and themes, and they

have an ability to flip it on its head. They'll take this sad, depressing scary moment and douse it with comedy. And that's hard to do effectively," Greene says.

"She is interesting and different from anything I've played," Greene says of Janine. "She is a CosPlay firecracker who ends up stealing Noah's heart. We're both a little awkward, and it brings us closer together."

Donald Faison, Braff's co-star from "Scrubs," has a cameo role as a car salesman. "I was very happy that Zach had a good follow-up to *Garden State*. This is the only thing that we've done together since 'Scrubs,' unless you count PSAs or going out to the club," Faison jokes.

Faison enjoyed his brief "Scrubs" reunion. "It's always fun working with your best friend. We have the same sense of humor. It's easy to make each other laugh. I can tell where he's going with something before he gets there," Faison comments.

Another cast member returning from previous work with Zach is Jim Parsons, who played a role in *Garden State*, and is playing the role of Paul, an actor friend of Aidan's, in *Wish I Was Here*. Parsons signed on to the project before the film was financed, and even participated in the original pitch video for Kickstarter. Parsons says, "The thing about Zach is that it really made a lot of sense to me that he needed to maintain creative control that maybe isn't as crucial to some other people. His vision is so strong and it's so uniquely his, that I think it's crucial that he's able to execute what it is that he was planning to."

Working with Zach for the second time was a thrill for Parsons, he says "Zach's motivations for making a good movie are very tied into making people happy. And I think it will. I'm really grateful to have the chance to make another movie with Zach"

Wish I Was Here shot over five weeks in Los Angeles on a relatively small budget. The quick pace and spare crew made for an exciting journey. "The franchises are fun and big, but it's a completely different feeling on an independent film," Greene, who starred in Twilight, one of the biggest franchises in film history, says. "It's not for the money, it's for the passion for me and for everyone involved. This film in particular is Zach's baby, and it's funded by fans of Zach, or of filmmaking, or of Garden State. It's an exciting, infectious vibe on set."

Not one cent of the limited budget went to waste. Atlanta-based Gagnon and his mother bunked at Braff's house instead of at a hotel. The actors' wardrobes were primarily their own, particularly Hudson. "Betsy took me shopping in my own closet. We picked out all my clothes for the movie in about an hour," says Braff. Additionally, the limited funds made for a quick pace on set. There was no time to waste. "It's a great opportunity as an actor. There isn't time to linger, take after take," Gad says. "You really have to come prepared."

"I prefer the pace of independent films. Like anything, when you're an actor, momentum is important. You get a little lazy when you're sitting around a set. When you're shooting a low budget film, you're moving really fast. There aren't a bunch of people waiting in trailers. You don't have any divas on set," Hudson comments.

For Hudson, seeing Braff direct *Wish I Was Here* was especially rewarding, given her closeness to the actor and filmmaker. "I love seeing my friends manifest their dreams and desires, especially creatively," Hudson says. "When you hear someone talk about what they want to be doing over a period of years, and then you see it happen and you're a part of it, you do have a sense of pride for your friends. You feel so proud of them."

"What's interesting to me is to see his professional side," Hudson muses. "We definitely do not have a professional relationship, though creatively we were always connected. Watching him in action has been inspiring to me."

"Working with Zach has been awesome," Gad agrees. "He has this nurturing way about him. I think it's because he's an actor so he knows what he's like. He has a way of allowing the actors to creatively make some decisions, but he guides you along the way. I don't think a lot of people have mastered that."

One major character in the film is the beautiful city of Los Angeles. Due to tax incentives in Louisiana, Georgia and elsewhere, Los Angeles-based productions are a rarity. "In any normal financing situation, we would have had to leave LA to find a city with a tax incentive," notes Braff. "Because of the crowd-funding, we were able to shoot the film where it actually takes place. This was one of the greatest gifts from

the backers, and it had so many ancillary benefits: casting, equipment, crew. It made the film what it is."

The Los Angeles location also made for a happy cast and crew. "Movies used to shoot in Los Angeles or New York. People were so happy to stay with their families in Los Angeles. When people see the movie, they'll see that we wanted to have Los Angeles be a character in the film, and to tell this story as an LA story," Braff says.

The last time I shot in Los Angeles was *Almost Famous*," Hudson recalls. "This is where Hollywood is, and where it should be. The crews are happy. Everybody's home. I forgot what that feels like. I'm never in LA! It's good to be home."

ABOUT THE CAST

ZACH BRAFF's (Aidan Bloom) career began with his success as an actor, but he has since found equal recognition for his distinctive writing, producing and directing of successful feature films, television series and stage productions.

One of the New Jersey native's most notable characters is that of Dr. John "J.D." Dorian on the beloved television series "Scrubs." During the half-hour comedy's nine-year run (175 episodes), Braff earned a Primetime Emmy and three consecutive Golden Globe nominations (2005-07) for his starring role. "Scrubs" also received numerous Emmy nominations for Best Comedy Series and Best Comedy Writing.

In addition to directing seven episodes of "Scrubs" (including the show's landmark 100th episode), Braff made his feature film debut behind the camera as the director and writer of his original comedy-drama *Garden State*, in which he also starred. Braff shot the coming-of-age film in his home state for a budget \$2.5 million, resulting in a \$5 million unprecedented sale to two studios, Fox Searchlight and Miramax, during its premiere at the 2004 Sundance Film Festival.

With a cast including Natalie Portman, Peter Sarsgaard and Ian Holm, *Garden State* grossed over \$35 million at the box office, won praise from film critics and received more than three-dozen award nominations. Braff won an Independent Spirit Award for Best First Feature and was nominated for Best First Screenplay. He also earned a Writers Guild nomination for Best Original Screenplay and picked up a Best Director honor from the National Board of Review (plus a second "special recognition" prize). The movie's breakthrough soundtrack sold more than 1,000,000 copies and earned Braff a Grammy Award for Best Compilation Soundtrack Album. Other *Garden State* honors for Braff include Breakthrough Director from the Hollywood Film Festival, a Most Promising Filmmaker Award from the Chicago Film Critics Association and a Grand Prize Jury nomination at the 2004 Sundance Film Festival.

In March 2014, Braff will make his Broadway debut in "Bullets Over Broadway," written by Woody Allen and directed by Susan Stroman, at the St. James Theatre. The musical stage production is based on the screenplay of Allen's 1994 comedic film. Set in 1920s New York, Braff plays a struggling playwright so desperate to get his latest drama produced that he casts a rich mobster's talentless girlfriend in exchange for financing.

Braff's theatre career has developed significantly over the last years. In 2012, he made his West End debut starring in his own original play, "All New People." The play was previously staged at Second Stage Theatre in New York in 2011, where Braff starred in Paul Weitz's original drama, "Trust," in 2010. His other theatre credits include the 1998 Joe Papp Public Theatre staging of Shakespeare's "Macbeth" and Papp's 2002 New York Shakespeare Festival production (at Central Park's Delacorte Theatre) of "Twelfth Night."

Prior to earning his film degree from Northwestern University, Braff made his big-screen acting debut in Woody Allen's 1993 comedy *Manhattan Murder Mystery* as Allen and Diane Keaton's son. Following college, he worked briefly at the

renowned Public Theatre in New York before relocating to Los Angeles. Braff's additional film acting credits include Greg Berlanti's poignant comedy *The Broken Hearts Club*, Tony Goldwyn's romantic comedy *The Last Kiss*, drama *The High Cost of Living*, romantic comedy *The Ex*, starring opposite Amanda Peet and Jason Bateman, drama *Getting to Know You*, adapted from works by Joyce Carol Oates, and he voiced the title character of Disney's 2005 animated hit *Chicken Little*. Television credits include a recurring role on the FOX-TV cult series "Arrested Development." Braff most recently appeared alongside James Franco in the 2013 Walt Disney Pictures' fantasy adventure *Oz: The Great and Powerful*, directed by Sam Raimi.

In 2008, Braff earned his pilot's license. He currently lives in New York and Los Angeles.

Golden Globe Award winner and Academy Award nominee KATE HUDSON (Sarah) made her studio film debut in 200 Cigarettes, co-starring with Ben Affleck, Courtney Love and Paul Rudd and went on to and her early films also included "Desert Blue" and Gossip, featuring James Marsden and Joshua Jackson. However, it was her career-making performance in Cameron Crowe's Almost Famous that won the hearts of critics and moviegoers around the world. Her portrayal of "band aid" Penny Lane earned her a Golden Globe Award, an Academy Award nomination as Best Supporting Actress and a BAFTA nomination, amongst numerous other honors and recognition.

She with roles in Robert Altman's Dr. T and the Women, About Adam and Shekhar Kapur's period remake of *The Four Feathers*, opposite Heath Ledger and Wes Bentley and achieved global box office success starring opposite Matthew McConaughey in the hit romantic comedy, How to Lose a Guy in 10 Days, which earned over \$200 million at the box office worldwide. Her films also include Alex & Emma for director Rob Reiner; Merchant-Ivory's contemporary comedy, Le Divorce and Garry Marshall's Raising Helen for Disney, as well as the psychological thriller, Skeleton Key. She starred in the comedy, You, Me and Dupree, opposite Owen Wilson, Matt Dillon and Michael Douglas, which grossed over \$100 million worldwide and, in early 2008, re-teamed with Matthew McConaughey in Warner Bros.' Fool's Gold, which was another worldwide box-office hit. She starred opposite Anne Hathaway in Bride Wars, which also marked her debut as a producer and dazzled in Rob Marshall's all-star movie musical, Nine, with Daniel Day-Lewis, Nicole Kidman, Marion Cotillard, Penelope Cruz and Sophia Loren. She appeared in Michael Winterbottom's provocative noir thriller, The Killer Inside Me, with Casey Affleck and Jessica Alba, the romantic comedy Something Borrowed, and was seen most recently in the dramatic thriller, The Reluctant Fundamentalist, which premiered at the Venice and Toronto International Film Festivals.

This year, guest-starred on the hit FOX series, "Glee," and the HBO original movie, "Clear History," with Larry David, John Hamm, Eva Mendes and Michael Keaton. She will next be seen in the thriller *Good People*, opposite James Franco.

In 2007, Hudson made her directorial debut with the short film, "Cutlass," as part of Glamour magazine's "Reel Moments." She is currently the face of Ann Taylor and she has been a Global Brand Ambassador for Almay since May 2010. 2011 saw

the launch of CH+KH, a unique line of jewelry and accessories Hudson created with her longtime friend Laurie Lynn Stark, co-owner of Chrome Hearts.

In his 1980 Broadway debut, MANDY PATINKIN (Saul) won a Tony Award for his role as Che in Andrew Lloyd Webber's "Evita" and was nominated in 1984 for his starring role as George in the Pulitzer Prize-winning musical, "Sunday in the Park with George." Other stage credits include: "Compulsion," "Paradise Found," "The Tempest," "Enemy of the People" (Williamstown Theater Festival), "The Wild Party," "The Secret Garden," "Falsettos," "The Winter's Tale," "The Knife," "Leave It to Beaver is Dead," "Rebel Women," "Hamlet," "Trelawney of the 'Wells," "The Shadow Box," "The Split," "Savages," and "Henry IV, Part I." Feature film credits include: Everybody's Hero, The Choking Man, Pinero, The Adventures of Elmo In Grouchland, Lulu on the Bridge, Men with Guns, The Princess Bride, Yentl, The Music of Chance, Daniel, Ragtime, Impromptu, The Doctor, Alien Nation, Dick Tracy, The House on Carroll Street, True Colors, Maxie, and Squanto: Indian Warrior.

Mandy won a 1995 Emmy Award for his performance in the CBS series "Chicago Hope", and starred in the CBS series "Criminal Minds" and in the Showtime Original Series "Dead Like Me". Patinkin returned to TV in the Emmy and Golden Globe Award winning Showtime Original Series "Homeland" as CIA Division Chief Saul Berenson.

In 1989, Patinkin began his concert career at Joseph Papp's Public Theater. This coincided with the release of his first solo album entitled *Mandy Patinkin*. Since then, he has created multiple solo concerts including *Dress Casual, Mamaloshen, Celebrating Sondheim*, and *Let Go*, which have toured extensively, appearing across the United States, Canada, London, and Australia. Mandy's recordings include *Mandy Patinkin In Concert: Dress Casual* on CBS Records, *Experiment, Oscar & Steve, Leonard Bernstein's New York, Kidults, Mamaloshen*, and *Mandy Patinkin Sings Sondheim* all recorded on the Nonesuch label.

In October 2007, Patinkin debuted a new concert with dear friend Patti LuPone and they continue touring their show "An Evening with Patti LuPone and Mandy Patinkin" throughout the US and most recently a 9-week Broadway run at the Barrymore Theatre. Patinkin continues to collaborate with "An Evening with Mandy Patinkin & Nathan Gunn" and "The Last Two People on Earth: An Apocalyptic Vaudeville" starring Patinkin and the performance artist Taylor Mac, directed and choreographed by Susan Stroman.

Patinkin resides in New York City with his wife, actress and writer Kathryn Grody.

JOSH GAD (Noah) brings wit, humor and depth to his roles on both the silver and small screens. The actor was recently seen in Shawn Levy's *The Internship*, opposite Vince Vaughn and Owen Wilson. Gad starred opposite Ashton Kutcher as Apple co-founder Steve Wozniak in the much anticipated biopic *JOBS*; and co-starred in *Thanks for Sharing*, opposite Gwyneth Paltrow, Mark Ruffalo and Tim Robbins. The film premiered at this year's Toronto International Film Festival.

Gad is currently co-writing *Triplets*, the sequel to Ivan Reitman's hit comedy *Twins*. The film is set to star Arnold Schwarzenegger, Danny DeVito and Eddie Murphy.

A talented voice actor, Gad is currently in production on the animated film *Me and My Shadow*, alongside Kate Hudson and Bill Hader. He also voices the character of Olaf in the forthcoming animated film *Frozen*, alongside Kristen Bell and Jonathan Groff. Other voice credits include *Ice Age: Continental Drift*, alongside Ray Romano, Queen Latifah, Jennifer Lopez and John Leguizamo.

Additional film credits include Ed Zwick's *Love & Other Drugs*, with Jake Gyllenhaal, Anne Hathaway, Judy Greer and Hank Azaria; Shawn Levy's *The Rocker*, alongside Rainn Wilson; *21*, opposite Kate Bosworth, Lawrence Fishburne and Kevin Spacey; and *Crossing Over*, with Harrison Ford, Sean Penn, Ray Liotta and Ashley Judd.

Gad served as an executive producer, co-creator and star on NBC's family comedy "1600 Penn." He played Skip Gilchrist, the clumsy eldest son of the President (Bill Pullman), whose sincere attempts to do the right thing often go awry.

He also received a People's Choice nomination for "Favorite TV Comedy Actor" in 2011 and was recently nominated again in 2012. In addition, Parsons won the award for "Best Actor in a Comedy Series_94 by the Broadcast Television Journalists Association for its very first Critics' Choice Television Awards. Parson has been nominated again in the same category for the 2nd Annual Critics Choice Television Awards.

Parsons received a Theatre World Award for his debut Broadway performance as Tommy Boatwright in "The Normal Heart," starring opposite Ellen Barkin, John Benjamin Hickey, and Joe Mantello. "The Normal Heart" won a Tony Award for "Best Revival of a Play_94 and was presented with the Drama Desk Award for "Outstanding Revival of a Play" and "Outstanding Ensemble Performance." "The Normal Heart" also received nominations from The Outer Critics Circle for "Outstanding Revival of a Play," as well as five Tony Award nominations.

Parsons also guest starred in an episode of the hit Nickelodeon sitcom "iCarly" starring Miranda Cosgrove, during its fourth season. He also appeared in the highly anticipated comedy "The Muppets" which opened in theaters in November of 2011.

Parsons appeared Fox 2000's comedy "The Big Year," opposite Rashida Jones, Anjelica Huston, Steve Martin, Jack Black, and Owen Wilson which premiered this past October, 2011. David Frankel directed the film based on Mark Obmascik's tome about three men who try to outdo each other during a year-long competition to spot the rarest birds in North America. Parsons has been nominated two years in a row (2009 and 2010) for the TCA Award for Individual Achievement in Comedy, in addition to winning the award in 2009. TV GUIDE calls Parsons "a marvelous discovery, creating the most hysterical misfit since Monk." "The Big Bang Theory" has helped CBS launch their Thursday night comedy line-up, regularly winning the night across all networks.

Previously, he has appeared on film in Todd Phillips "School for Scoundrels" opposite Billy Bob Thorton and Jon Heder for The Weinstein Company as well as Chris Terrio's "Heights\\\\\\^4\ opposite Glenn Close and James Marsden for Merchant/Ivory. He has also created scene stealing roles in several independent films such as Zach Braff's "Garden State", Kevin Connolly's "Gardner of Eden" and Danny Leiner's "The Great New Wonderful."

Parsons has performed in many stage productions including "The Castle" for the Manhattan Ensemble Theater, "The Countess" for the Globe Theater as well as "The Tempest" and "As You Like It" for the Houston Shakespeare Festival.

Parsons has earned a Masters in Fine Arts degree from the Old Globe Theater/University of San Diego and a BA from the University of Houston. He currently resides in Los Angeles.
