



SYNOPSIS

An adaptation of Chuck Palahniuk's *(Fight Club)* novel, CHOKE is a powerful (and hilarious) film about love and strife between mothers and sons, the addictive power of sex, the terrors of aging, the ugly truth about historical theme parks, and much more.

Victor Mancini (Sam Rockwell), a dropout from medical school, has devised a complicated scam to pay for his mother's (Anjelica Huston) elder care: Pretend to be choking on a piece of food in a restaurant and the person who "saves you" will feel responsible for the rest of his life. Multiply that a couple of hundred times and you generate a healthy flow of checks, week in, week out. Between fake choking gigs, Victor works at Colonial Dunsboro with a motley group of losers and stoners trapped in 1734, cruises sex addiction groups for action, and strikes up an unlikely affair with a nurse (Kelly MacDonald) at the hospital where he visits his mother, whose anarchic streak made his childhood a mad whirl and whose Alzheimer's disease now hides what may be the startling truth about his (possibly divine?) parentage.




CLARK GREGG – WRITER/DIRECTOR



Clark Gregg has spun a successful career on the New York stage into a growing profile in motion pictures and television as an actor, writer, and director. Clark Gregg's career as an actor began when he was a student at New York University, where he became a protégé of noted playwright and director David Mamet. Mamet cast Gregg in his first film role -- a small part in 1988's Things Change -- and that same year he made his off-Broadway debut in Howard Korder's play A Boy's Life. With Mamet's help, Gregg cofounded the esteemed Atlantic Theater Company in New York in the late '80s, and in 1990, Greag made his Broadway debut in Agron Sorkin's drama A Few Good Men. Through the 1990s, Gregg gave a number of strong supporting performances in such films as Clear and Present Danger, The Usual Suspects, and Magnolia, with Gregg earning a Best Supporting Actor nomination at the Independent Spirit Awards for his striking turn as a transsexual in the independent feature The Adventures of Sebastian Cole. In television, Gregg scored recurring roles on the shows The Commish and Sports Night, as well as guest appearances on Sex and the City and The West Wing. And he remained a nearconstant presence on the New York stage, earning Outer Critics Circle, Obie, and Drama Desk nominations for his work. Greag also began directing for the stage, including wellreceived productions of Mamet's Edmond and Kevin Heelan's Distant Fires. In the late '90s, Gregg developed an interest in screenwriting, and began working on a supernatural thriller in his spare time. As chance would have it, Gregg's script came to the attention of Robert Zemeckis, who was eager to direct a thriller; Gregg's first screenplay became What Lies Beneath, which starred Michelle Pfeiffer and Harrison Ford, and became a major box-office success.

Mr. Fennell is President and a member of the Board of Managers of the 12th Floor Film Fund. He is a founding member of ATO Pictures and has been Managing Director since its inception in June 2002. Prior to joining ATO, Mr. Fennell worked for Media General, Inc. as President of Boxerjam Media, Inc., an interactive entertainment company. Mr. Fennell co-founded Boxerjam in 1994, with Julann Griffin the creator of the television show "Jeopardy!" and co-managed the company to become the leading interactive entertainment provider for AOL, Sony Station and Yahoo! Games. In 1995, Mr. Fennell cofounded Boxer Learning, an award-winning, online education company distributed in over a thousand schools worldwide. Mr. Fennell attended the American Film Institute as a directing fellow and directed the award winning short, Howard Black, with John C. Reilly.

As producers for ATO Pictures, Dorfman and Fennell produced Amandla! A Revolution in Four-Part Harmony which sold to Artisan and won the Audience Award and The Freedom of Expression Award at Sundance in 2002, the News and Documentary Emmy Award in 2004 and over ten other awards. In 2006, they produced Joshua, starring Sam Rockwell and Vera Farmiga, which sold to Fox Searchlight and was nominated for the Grand Jury Prize and won the Cinematography Prize at Sundance 2007. In 2007, ATO Pictures executive produced Savage Grace, starring Julianne Moore, Stephen Dillane and Eddie Redmayne and High Water, a documentary about big wave surfing directed by Dana Brown (Step Into Liquid)
